



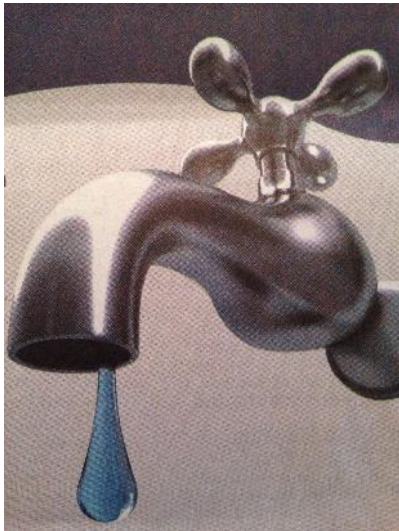

The City of Roseville will be holding a public hearing regarding **Proposition 218** on *Wednesday, May 6, 2015 at 7:00 P.M. in the City Council Chambers at 311 Vernon Street* to consider adoption of proposed increases to rates for water and wastewater utility services, and modifications to water shortage surcharges and excess water use charges. Reasons for the proposed rate increases and revisions, and instructions for protesting the rate increases were provided in a pamphlet distributed to Roseville residents by the City of Roseville Environmental Utilities department.

After many residents have expressed concerns to the Roseville Police Department about drivers running stop signs or speeding down narrow streets, Officer Darren Kato has been spotted in some problem areas, including the intersection of Keehner/Hillcrest/Lorraine, and on King Road. Sergeant Jason Bosworth suggested using a steering wheel club as a deterrent for vehicle thefts, as well as removing personal items from view. He recommended asking any solicitors for proof of their permits since all solicitors are required to have permits in the City of Roseville. The City of Roseville's Environmental Utilities Department offers a free pick-up service for Roseville residents for a wide array of electronic waste and other household hazardous waste items. To schedule a pick-up

appointment time at your doorstep, call (916) 774-5780. *Eligible items include: Common household batteries, fluorescent tubes and bulbs, water heaters, thermostats, mercury thermometers, televisions, VCRs, computers, computer monitors, printers, printer cartridges, stereos, cell phones, telephones, motor oil, automotive batteries, cooking fats, oils, and grease.*

Good News for Garbolino Park



The Parks, Recreation & Libraries Department of the City of Roseville has outlined play areas that are in need of replacement. While all play structures meet safety codes and requirements, updates/replacements are necessary to ensure overall compliance and to enhance the visitors' park experience. An evaluation of all play structures was conducted and Garbolino Park has been identified as the next play area to be addressed.
